FIFe Members may accept membership of an individual involved in a non-FIFe association as a functionary in consideration of Statutes Article 2.7 and provided the individual has completed a written undertaking to abide by all FIFe Statutes and Rules.

Special exceptions may be granted by the Executive Board of FIFe.

Motivation

We should be proud that members from other associations want to join FIFe and embrace this as part of FIFe's continued expansion and development into the future.

A Member of the FIFe may, following the membership-change procedure, accept as members, individuals from other countries no matter if there is a FIFe Member in that country or not. In case the current FIFe Member does not approve the application, the new FIFe Member may send this application to the FIFe Board for consideration.

If the applicant is not an individual member of a FIFe Member, the present FIFe Member shall confirm the non-membership status.

If the applicant is an individual member of a FIFe Member, the present FIFe Member shall inform the new FIFe Member of any existing sanctions, if any. In case of existing sanction, it is up to the new FIFe Member to accept the application. The New FIFe Member will inform the current FIFe Member and the FIFe Board if application is accepted or not within one month from the request.

Any existing sanctions on the *individual m*Member by the current FIFe Member must be respected by the new FIFe Member. In case the new FIFe Member does not agree then he may send this application to the FIFe Board for consideration. *In this case, the FIFe Board shall give a feedback to the Members concerned within one month from the request.*

Motivation

The Constitutions of all democratic Countries (and of the European Union – Charter of fundamental rights of European Union) guarantee freedom of choice for all citizens, as far as association, politic, religion, expression, thinking is concerned. Also FIFe and its Members must respect this fundamental principle and cannot deny this freedom to anyone and, specifically, a request for change of membership within FIFe Members.

At the GA 2017, this article has been updated: the new FIFe Member must respect any sanction imposed to an individual that wants to change his membership. This is a guarantee for all Members. Application for membership may also come from individuals that have no membership in a FIFe Member country, and even more in these cases, freedom of choice and association must be guaranteed and respected. The "consultation" between FIFe Members is appropriate, but no "permission" should be necessary. This way, even the procedure becomes faster and easier to follow for all concerned.

The FIFe Board shall be informed about any change of membership, but should be consulted only if there is a disagreement between Members on possible sanctions, in which case, it must give an answer as soon as possible to allow individuals to become full members of the new FIFe Member and get all services they may need.

If this proposal is carried, the present Membership change procedures shall be deleted, as the article also includes the procedure quite clearly, and because all the consequences due to change of membership (cattery names, etc.) are obvious.

Motivation

<u>General:</u> A brush Peterbald is fully recognized, and one type should therefore not be preferred over the other. <u>Head:</u> As for the shape of the head, a Peterbald shall never be exactly like a Siamese. The Don Sphynx will always be visible to some degree, and they have a somewhat flatter forehead/ top of head. This is visible in the Peterbald to some degree, even after lots of outcrossing and generations.

<u>Eyes:</u> With good selection in breeding most of the deep set and/or narrowed eyes can be avoided and the possibilities for outcrossing are readily available. The eyes can be an annoying element for the cat.

Therefore, we do not want to reward such eyes with certificates, to further the work of eliminating these types of eyes.

<u>Skin</u>: As for the quality of the skin, our opinion is that the wrinkles act differently in each individual, so the part about placement of wrinkles is obsolete. We find it important to note that there is generous skin, so a fold of skin under the belly etc. is often seen, even on slim cats. Furthermore, we would like to clarify the way brush coat often appears.

We find it important to clarify these things as the Peterbald is still a rare breed, making it hard for everyone to get experienced with the unique aspects of the breed.

Felis Hungarica recommends that SPH and DRX breeds should be replaced in Category III. #

Motivation

When creating new categories, the idea behind was to include elegant or thinner body, longer headed cats in Category IV. SPH and DRX are both much closer to Category III breeds regarding both their build and head shape. We believe that this revision would lead to easier and more objective judgements. We are aware that the formation of new categories has been preceded by thorough calculations and deliberations, but besides having mathematically identical categories, it is also very important to have similarity in body composition since this mathematical balance can be upset whenever new breeds are adopted.

We propose to separate the Siamese tipped points from the Siamese tabby points for BSH and BLH. Separation of the agouti patterns (11 33 / 21 33) in BSH/BLH s/y, which are currently together in EMS 21 33, into the following:

* Siamese silver tipped pointed - n/a/b/c/d/e/f/g/h/j/o/p/q/r s 11 33

* Siamese silver tabby pointed - n/a/b/c/d/e/f/g/h/j/o/p/q/r s 21 33

* Siamese golden tipped pointed - n/a/b/c/d/e/f/g/h/j/o/p/q/r y 11 33

* Siamese golden tabby pointed - n/a/b/c/d/e/f/g/h/j/o/p/q/r y 21 33

At this moment these are judged together in the same class under the EMS code 21 33 (Siamese tabby pointed). If this proposal is carried, the colour description of the varieties (s/y 11 33) regarding to BSH and BLH needs to be changed consequently.

Motivation

The combination of the tipped (11) and tabby (21) pointed in one EMS code is causing confusion for breeders in terms of both registration, clarity in pedigree registration (reading the pedigree) and at shows. There is a distinct difference in phenotype, but without a proper split in EMS codes there is no written difference in genotype.

Siamese s/y tipped pointed (11/33) cats have a different expression in pattern compared to Siamese s/y tabby pointed (21 33) cats. Siamese s/y tipped pointed (11/33) cats show no expression of the tabby pattern which is clearly desired in Siamese s/y tabby pointed (21 33) cats, as described in the standard. Therefore, Siamese s/y tipped pointed (11/33) cats have difficulty competing for certificates in a show class where they actually don't belong in. Due to the absence of pattern they can't obtain the required allocated points for colour and pattern that are in the standard for Siamese s/y tabby pointed (21 33) cats. Also, a clear way of registering the cats to what they actually are, will definitely enhance the breeding of these varieties.

Motivation

All cats are judged by phenotype. In our General Part of Standards are very clear descriptions of pattern *25, ticked tabby with very illustrative drawing of a ticked tabby coat, and of *11, shaded: BLH/BSH tipped with very illustrative drawings of individual hair in different varieties and a tipped coat. Since golden ticked tabby varieties were recognised most of shown cats in these colour varieties do not really show clear ticked tabby markings as required for a ticked tabby cat, which only increase with the age of a cat. Therefore, most of cats shown in both varieties: golden tipped and golden ticked tabby, are changed from show to show or class to class to different varieties, from *25 to *11 and back again. All these permanent colour changes are very confusing and disappointing for exhibitors.

For these reasons BLH/BSH golden tipped and ticked tabby varieties of the same colour should be judged together in the same class, and for judging purposes solely.

Motivation

At the General Assembly 2017 the breeds SRL/SRS were fully recognized. At the same time, changes in the breed standard and the Scale of Points were accepted. One of these changes reduced the number of points allotted to colour and pattern from 10 to 0 (zero). SRL/SRS now has the same number of points for coat and pattern as the other rex breeds (Cornish, Devon and German Rex): zero.

For this reason, it is only logical the recognized varieties of all rexed breeds should be identical within the 9 colour groups in which they are judged at shows. CRX, DRX and GRX already have EMS code 09 listed in their table of recognized varieties, we now propose to add this code in the relevant groups for SRL/SRS to achieve identical tables.

Motivation

The proposal to allow all eye colours in the Turkish Van is an adjustment to reality. After many years of breeding it has become clear that the eye colour in high grade white cats is not stable over time. The definition of "light amber" is difficult since amber can present in a wide spectrum of nuances. There is a risk that cats that meet the standard in all other aspects, but not have light amber eye colour, may be excluded from breeding and shows, which is unfortunate for a small breed. Having discussed this problem with many judges over a long time, we propose that all eye colours be allowed. This is also in line with the current practice of judging the cats together regardless of eye colour. As a consequence of this, we propose that 5 points be moved from Eyes to Body, to emphasize the importance of a good body type.

LaPerm Longhair (LPL) and LaPerm Shorthair (LPS) were fully recognised in FIFe in 2015 and were classified as a breed in category II (now category 2), judged by 11 groups.

Our proposal is to move the LaPerm Longhair (LPL) and LaPerm Shorthair (LPS) from category 2 to category 4, judged by 9 groups.

Any judges who have passed the relevant exam for category 2 (or category II) including LaPerm LPL/LPS in their questions, will have an exception for these breeds when studying category 4.

Motivation

LaPerm breeders see their cats as more suitable for category 4 because of their type, appearance and similarities to other breeds in the group, which was introduced for the rex breeds, the hairless breeds and breeds with elegant type. The LaPerm is a medium sized and moderately elegant rex breed with a curly coat. We would not want to lose focus on important features, especially on the elegant type, by placing them with breeds like MCO and NFO that are larger and more substantial or heavy in built.

Thank you for your attention. We hope you will support our proposal and the LaPerm will join the rex group in category 4.

As a consequence, also modify the standards for EXO, PER, BLH and BSH where recognised eye colours are defined to include odd eyes and blue eyes as allowable eye colours in the 03 colour varieties.

Motivation

When it was decided to allocate eye colour EMS codes for all 01 and 02 cats, all breed standards were modified to show the recognised eye colours for these cats and the Standard – General Part was modified as above to indicate that they should be judged in the same class. Bicolour (03) cats can also have odd eyes (rarely) and blue eyes (very rarely). The FIFe JSC sees no need to register all bicolour (03) cats with eye colour EMS codes but it is important to highlight that these cats are recognised for show in the breeds where recognised eye colours are defined.

The cattery name is registered with the country code of the FIFe Member, to which the breeder belongs. The country code must be placed before or after the cattery name with an *. (e.g. Homer von der Schattenburg*AT or DE*Calenacat's Renato JW)

The use of a cattery name not registered in the FIFe BCN is not allowed for any individual member.

Motivation

The registration of the country code with the cattery name is already in use by several FIFe members and it makes sense to standardise this practice within FIFe in a similar way as the pedigree number.

SIA / BAL / OSH / OLH or crosses with these breeds used for breeding must be DNA tested for CEP290 (PRA-rdAC) prior to mating, unless both parents of the breeding cats are proven not to carry PRA (N/N).

Only the following matings are allowed:

- PRA non-carrier (N/N) x PRA non-carrier (N/N)
- PRA non-carrier (N/N) x PRA carrier (N/rdAC)

The results must be registered and published in accordance with § 3.5.1.

Motivation

UC Davis has estimated that 33% of our cats are carriers of this disease, which causes permanently reduced sight or blindness, and it must be considered a cronic condition. As a reliable test is available, we believe that it is necessary to test in order to know the status of the breeding cats and avoid mating carrier to carrier.



In regards of National Laws, the Book of Origin of a FIFé Member might consider a control of the cat before its registration, based on its adherence to the FIFé standard, to be evaluated by a FIFé International Judge upon request of the Book of Origin of the Member itself.

Remark

Some imports coming from other Federations might not be consistent to the FIFé standard, thus an opinion of a Judge is relevant before registering the cat to the Book of Origin.

The term "var" may be added to the EMS-code to indicate that a shorthair cat carries or may carry the gene for longhair.

A new point after 6.1.3 (new § 6.2):

For Abyssinians from Somali lines, it is mandatory that "var" follows the EMS code endlessly in all FIFe pedigrees.

Motivation

It appears that some FIFe countries do not use the "var" marking in their pedigrees so that it has become difficult for Abyssinian breeders to be sure that the cats they want to use in their breeding do not actually come from Somali lines and can be carrier of longhair. Some breeders claim that they will register their cats in CFA because they no longer trust FIFe's pedigrees.

The FIFe title of "Distinguished Merit" (DM) shall be awarded to a cat according with the following rules:

- a. The required number of offspring to gain the titles of IC/IP or higher, *alternatively DSM, DVM, JW* or DM, should be a minimum of 5 for a female cat and a minimum of 10 for a male cat.
- b. Only FIFe registered titles are valid.
- c. The owner may claim the title "DM" in the same manner as other existing titles are claimed.
- d. The "DM" shall be placed after the full name of the cat.

Motivation

To include DM, but not DSM, DVM or JW, in offspring as a qualifying merit for a cat to gain the DM title is not logic. DSM, DVM and JW are titles awarded only to cats reaching very high points. It may be argued that the expression "or higher" under (a) could refer to these titles; however, it appears that "or higher" only refers to Championship/Premiership titles (see Table under 5.3.1). Accordingly, it should be specified that all Merit titles (DM, DSM, DVM) as well as JW in offspring should count as qualification for DM.



The JSC believes that, before the training starts, the steward should have a wider view of other countries cats, show organizations and systems. This would also help improving the language and the social skills of the future Student Judge candidate and in general would give the steward a more international experience.

Change the second paragraph as follows:

This examination must be taken in *English language* one of the three official FIFe languages and will be conducted by the Member to which the candidate belongs.

Motivation

English is the most current spoken foreign language being taugth since beginning at school and, with very few exceptions, spoken by all FIFe judges and pupils according to the Judges List.

We already require for every new student to understand English because all FIFe seminars are held in this language. As a matter of fact we have noticed in the past that preliminary exam sets in German and French have been required by candidates who had these languages as mother tongue but were also able to communicate English as well. The JSC believes that updating preliminary exams questionnaires and setting preliminary exames in French and German is no longer necessary now because English is spoken and understood in all countries where FIFe has National members. In the period 2008-2017 there were 160 preiminary exams. Of these 8 were in German and 2 were in French.

Motivation

FIFe presently recognizes a total of 48 breeds and the JSC believes that it takes time to become a professional and experienced Judge. A student should focus exclusively on one category at the time and concentrate on judging in the category he has been appointed, for at least as long as the required time for training in the second/third/fourth category, and refrain from "running" to becoming All Breed in the shortest time possible.

We propose to add the following point at the end of article 2.3.7.1:

Giving the possibility to split the exam would also minimize the effort for the organizing clubs and would result in less stress for the candidate in case, for instance, the number of cats may not be reached.

With this proposal, we would like to charge the show commission with the assignment to review the current FIFe show system and to bring a number of proposals to the FIFe General Assembly 2019 to modernize our show system. The workgroup should find answers to the following points (amongst others, the list can be completed through a survey amongst the members):

- Drop in number of exhibitors at shows
- Increasing the interest / involvement of exhibitors during the entire show day
- Safeguard the qualitative feed-back from the current system towards exhibitors (whether or not via an extensive written report)
- Upgrading the national show system, to give a solution for exhibitors, not wanting to travel abroad
- Guaranteeing the value of FIFe titles (international titles must remain international)
- Creating a uniform show system (preferably without exceptions), which can work for all members

Motivation

We see a drop in the number of exhibitors everywhere. Also the age of the average exhibitor is not always getting younger. Although we are all convinced of the quality of our show system and the importance of giving a qualitative feedback to the exhibitor, we all have to admit young people are not always motivated to start in our show system and some exhibitors are discouraged after e.g. receiving an EX 2 at the start of the show day, only having to wait until the day is over. As a leading Cat Fanciers organization, we should not stand still and look to the future. If FIFe wants to stay the leading organization, we must lead the way and keep reinventing ourselves...

With this proposal, we want to start the discussion. Think outside the Box!

In this class cats are exhibited who will not be presented to a judge.

Class 15b: Out of competition only for classification and certificates

In this class cats can be judged who are not yet admitted to the following higher class, because they already have obtained the maximum number of required certificates for a title in one country and may not be registered in the following higher class since certificates from a second or third country are missing.

These cats will obtain a qualification without classification and can compete for BIV and BIS.

§ 4.7 Going to a higher class

As soon as an exhibit has obtained all required certificates towards a title, in consideration of § 4.2, 4.3, 4.4, 4.5 and 4.6, it is obligatory for this cat to be exhibited in the following higher class.

A cat that has already obtained the maximum number of required certificates towards a title in the same country, may not be entered in the concerning class on a show in this country again. As long as it does not fulfil the requirements for the following higher class, the cat may only be exhibited out of competition in class 15b.

Motivation

With this new rule, cats can be exhibited furthermore, even if they cannot go to the following higher class. In a two-certificate show, an exhibitor does no longer have to withdraw his cat, who obtained on the first day its last certificate in a country. Exhibitors who are not able to participate in shows abroad will get the possibility to present their cats furthermore to the judges.

This title is only available at International Shows to cats of fully recognised breeds. In order to obtain the title, the cat must win Best in Show a minimum of 5 times in classes 11 and/or 12.

The 5th Best in Show has to be obtained in class 11 in order to prevent the cat to become JW too quickly.

Exceptions are made for individual members residing in the countries as outlined in Annex 5.

Motivation

The intention of the proposal is to encourage exhibitors to take the immune system of the kittens into consideration, their vulnerability and general health, and to try to limit the number of shows for these cats.

On behalf of Felis Britannica, the Felis Britannica Board would like to ask for prolongation of the exception in Art.1.8g of the FIFe Show Rules, until 31.12.2021 reducing the number of cats required for an International show under FIFe rules to 100, of which, at least 80% must be pedigree cats entered for competition and listed in the catalogue.

Motivation

The UK continues to face enormous difficulties due to our isolated status, competition from other registered bodies for showing in the UK, together with the ever increasing worries over Brexit and Border controls and how this may impact on current pet passport regulations. We rarely get any exhibitors from overseas due to the costs charged at border control to bring pets in and out of the country, leaving us with UK resident members only.

Felis Britannica propose to prolong art 8.2.4, Open Doors. We propose that this rule be extended until 31.12.2021.

Motivation

The UK still faces considerable competition for exhibitors from other registry bodies active within the UK, GCCF, TICA and more recently the re-emergence of CFA. Open Doors allows our exhibitors to try the FIFe showing format before deciding whether they want to join FIFe. We have seen more exhibitors over the past 12 months wanting to try our format as a different option and allowing this to continue for a further three years will allow this momentum to continue and result in further members/exhibitors for FIFe.

Judges should indicate the exact score the cat they judged achieved out of the possible 100 in the judge's report.

Motivation

This addition would make it clear to exhibitors why a particular cat can or cannot achieve a specific title in its class, why or why not it can be Best in Variety or nominated. It is not always comprehensible for exhibitors that for example, a cat which has achieved CACIB may not have enough points to be nominated... The standard for each breed specifies exactly how many points a particular cat can receive for eyes, coat, build, ears, etc. It would be important to see that the evaluation of an outstandingly important attribute for that breed is also present in the final score and judging followed the standard.

If during the vetting in or during the show the officiating veterinarian discovers that a cat shows symptoms of sickness (for example: viral, bacterial, fungal or parasitical), the cat in question, together with all other cats belonging to the same exhibitor, will be denied admission to the show hall resp. must be removed immediately from the show hall.

In case of unclarity or discussion another veterinarian will be immediately asked for a second opinion. In case there is only one veterinarian, this option is not applicable. The outcome in this case is binding.

Motivation

It is important that in case an exhibitor is denied during vetting in the grounds for denial are correct. This proposal further decreases the possibility of potential errors and disappointed exhibitors.

- 2. Exhibitors belonging to any non-FIFe organisation may enter cats at FIFe shows under the following conditions:

 Classes 7 and 8 only apply when their cats have acquired the required FIFe certificates in classes 9 and/or 10.

Remark

Carrying this proposal would require changes to articles 4.6 of the FIFe Show Rules.

Motivation

Taking the current situation into consideration, expanding the 'Open Doors" for non-FIFe members/exhibitors will attract more exhibitors to FIFe shows and will give non-FIFe members an even better introduction to FIFe. In some countries, the number of non-FIFe members is high. This proposal allows them to exhibit at shows in higher classes before becoming a FIFe member.

Motivation

We experience that breeders and exhibitors of a wide variety of breeds feel that their cats are not "adults" at 10 months. They want to postpone entering in class 9/10 until the cats are 12 months and rather continue competing in class 11 two more months. This will also expand the period to obtain the JW title with two months.

Remark

If this proposal is carried, all other relevant articles in the Show Rules etc. must be amended accordingly.

Class 9: Open class

This class is open to cats which are aged at least 40 12 months during the show, in consideration of § 1.17.e and § 3.1. In this class a CAC is awarded.

Class 10: Neuter class

This class is open to castrated cats which are aged at least 10 12 months during the show, in consideration of § 1.17.e and § 3.1. In this class a CAP is awarded.

Class 11: Junior (7-10 8-12 months) class

This class is open to cats which are aged **7 8** months during the show, but not yet **10 12** months old, in consideration of § 1.17.e and § 3.1.

Class 12: Kitten (4-7 4-8 months) class

This class is open to cats which are aged 4 months during the show, but not yet **7 8** months old, in consideration of § 1.17.e and § 3.1.

Motivation

The previous change of age in Class 11 and Class 12 has led to a shorter total time in these two classes. Many breeds develop slowly, and two additional months in the kitten and junior classes would give the cats more time to mature before entering the adult show classes. When changing from 10 to12 months in Class 9 and Class 10, it follows naturally that 8 months will become the break between Class 11 and Class 12.

In some countries, judges (all breed) are given 4 categories and often Breed BIS or Special Breed competitions, plus housecats. This means Judges are working for ordinary judging in all categories, nominations for all categories and at least 4 best in show panels. We believe that for a more professional work, it would be better to concentrate only on 2 categories per day.

 - 1x Best in Variety in classes 7 12 or
 - 1x Nomination for Best in Show in classes 7 12.
- c. Classes 8 and 10 (neuters):

No qualification needed for cats having obtained the title International Champion or higher, these cats are automatically qualified.

- d. Class 11 (juniors):
 - 3x Excellent 1 in class 11 12 or
 - 1x Best in Variety in classes 11 12 or
 - 1x Nomination for Best in Show in classes 11 12.
- e. <u>Class 12 (kittens):</u>
 - 1x Excellent 1 in class 12.
- f. Class 14 (house cats):
 - 1x Nomination for Best in Show house cats
 - No qualification needed for Distinguished Show Merit (DSM) house cats, these cats are automatically qualified.

In all cases where qualifications apply: the qualification period is the 13 months period prior to the World Show.

Qualifications obtained during the 13 months period prior to the World Show by cats belonging to breeds resp. varieties in preliminary recognition phase are valid if the breed resp. variety achieves full recognition prior to the date of the World Show.

The qualification for the World Show is checked and confirmed by the National Federation or Club where the exhibitor holds his membership.

Motivation

The Show Commission became aware that the qualifications for the World Show as laid down in the Show Rules keep on causing unclearities and misunderstandings. We try to solve this by fully describing the applicable minimum qualifications for each class in which cats can compete at the World Show.

- 1. Those judges who did not vote for the cats with the highest number of votes shall vote again, this time considering only the cats that obtained the highest number of votes.

A referee judge is a judge officiating at the show who is qualified to judge the relevant category or the presented breeds but who did not actually judge any cat of fully recognised breeds in the official show classes 1 – 12 in the category during the show participate in voting in the particular panel.

If a referee judge is not available, a decision must be made by the drawing lots.

Motivation

The Show Commission realised that last years' accepted addition to § 4.9.7.2 is not clearly formulated and therefore rather difficult to read. This proposal suggests a rewording for a better understanding.
